CULTURAL EDUCATION OFFERS FROM MILTON KEYNES BASED ARTS AND HERITAGE ORGANISATIONS

Back in 2015 Arts Council England (ACE) became concerned about the government's dwindling commitment to include cultural education in the curriculum. Not only does every child have the right to experience arts and culture, but the benefits of taking part in cultural activity impact on mental and physical well-being, provide new perspectives on the world, and increase skills such as empathy and creative thinking. These are all essential qualities for people who make positive change in society and the workplace. As a response ACE supported Bridge organisations to set up Cultural Education Partnerships in different localities to address the cultural education needs specific to that area. From that initiative Artswork, the Bridge organisation, for the South East supported MAKE to develop.

MAKE (Milton Keynes Arts Education) is a call to action. It calls on Milton Keynes to fight for its young people's cultural education and creativity. With over 60 partners including teachers, arts and heritage organisations, and other strategic stakeholders it brings people together to deliver strong local provision of cultural education and creative thinking. MAKE's partners mean that its make-up is unique to Milton Keynes. Together we create a model for cultural education that cannot be repeated elsewhere.

MAKE has published a collaborative Cultural Education Strategy based around three key strands:

- 1. Happier, Healthier, Greener Young People
- 2. Exploring, Discovering and Enabling Inclusive and Environmentally Friendly Creativity
- 3. Careers, Skills and Opportunities

Since 2015 MAKE has built capacity and networks that align to these strands. The work has has increased the take up of Arts Awards for over 2,000 children and young people, and 33 schools in Milton Keynes have now signed up to the Artsmark journey. We hold quarterly meetings for our partners where we discuss different networking opportunities and ways to increase cultural education in the area. Arts1 is Led by Principal and co-founder Rebecca Carrington and internationally recognised Estill voice coach James Grimsey, the team combine their experience working within leading institutions and drama schools with their vision for excellence. The school is set apart by its caring approach, to developing the region's top talent and was the winner of the BTEC Showstopper Awards in 2018. Arts1 has a team of over 25 teachers who all specialise in their own fields. We strive to treat each student as an individual and coach them on their own journey through Arts1. We cater for children as young as three up to 16 in our Part Time School, we run a 6th form for 16+ training and following this we run a range of adult classes.

Arts1 Part Time School

Our Pre-Vocational training at Arts1 starts from 3 years old and students can join us at any age up to age 16. Managed by our Head of Pre-Vocational Training, Ross Jardine Wight, the school caters for over 400 students in all forms of Musical Theatre, Acting, Dance and instrument tuition. We run over 80 classes per week; Musical Theatre is run by Sophie Watts, our quality lead for the school, and our voice team who train students in the foundations of musical theatre covering acting, singing and dance. Sam Grassick, Head of Pre-Vocational Dance, looks after all of our dance classes. Sam herself teaches ISTD Modern and Tap, and looks after a team of highly skilled teachers who teach RAD Ballet, Commercial Street and Jazz. Gemma Kendall, who is currently completing her masters degree at The Central School of Speech and Drama in Actor Training works with all of our acting students, building their confidence and taking them to new levels of performance. Alongside these group classes we provide over 80 1to1 lessons a week, these can be taken in Singing & Voice, Acting, Piano, Guitar or Dance, again these are all led by specialist teachers from our team. Our admin team help match students to the classes to suit them best both at skill level and interest and our team can then guide and support students to reach their goals, whether that is to have fun or become a professional in this industry. We always seek and encourage students to find performance opportunities and we produce shows and concerts throughout the year.

Arts1 Sixth Form

Our full-time students train for 2 years to achieve specialist A-level equivalent qualifications in Dance, Acting and Musical Theatre. Over the past 5 years our sixth form has established itself as one of the UK's leading providers of performance training for 16 – 19 year olds. A large proportion of Arts1 Sixth Form students live in Milton Keynes and the surrounding areas and we also have a significant number of students auditioning from around the UK and internationally. Our graduating students often progress into Higher Education at Conservatoires and Universities where they complete their training and enter into the industry. Arts1 students have achieved places to train at schools including Arts Educational School, Guildford School of Acting, Mountview, Urdang Academy, Laine Theatre Arts and The Royal Birmingham Conservatoire. Whilst training at Arts1 we invite a wide range of industry figures in to work with the students from the world of Theatre, TV and Film, this gives our students the beginnings of a professional network that they take forward into their career. Our team of specialist teachers develop the talents of each individual in the areas of Dance, Voice and Acting as well as learning the broader academic and contextual with industry based teachers.



Artswork believes all children and young people have the right to experience the richness of the arts, both in and outside of school. We bridge together the work of arts and cultural organisations, schools and communities, as the South East Bridge organisation, and strive for equal access to life-changing arts and culture, for *all* children and young people. Artswork works together and supports MAKE to make this a reality in Milton Keynes.

Artwork supports <u>Arts Award</u> and <u>Artsmark</u>, provides <u>professional development training</u> to support you in your work with children and young people, and produces <u>resources</u>, <u>case studies</u>, <u>and research</u>.

Artsmark

The Artsmark award is a practical tool for schools and education settings seeking to exploit the benefits that developing their arts provision can bring to pupils, staff and communities. Artsmark will help your school help unlock the potential of children and young people, develop character, talent and confidence and increase their knowledge and understanding. It will provide CPD opportunities for staff and create and develop partnerships with the arts and cultural community beyond school.

Arts Award

Developed association with Arts Council England, the Arts Award qualifications are managed by Trinity College London. Arts Award offers children and young people a journey of personal, creative discovery through five levels, four qualifications and an introductory award, that can be integrated into the curriculum or used to certificate enrichment activities. Arts Award is assessed on submitted work, not examination, and can be wholly or partly digital making it easily adaptable to blended or on-line learning.

Onsite, Offsite and now Online.

During World War 2 Bletchley Park's codebreakers faced adverse conditions and battled against the clock to get results. Sound familiar? In the current challenging circumstances, we are proud to be able to offer opportunities for students to continue learning about Bletchley Park's inspiring story.

Onsite

School and other learning group visits are available during term time, providing opportunities for students to engage with Bletchley Park's story, its wider relevance to contemporary history and our own lives today. During a visit students will experience a guided tour around the outside of the buildings, providing opportunity for students to delve deeper into the story of Bletchley Park; an interactive workshop; and some self-guided time to explore the Park whilst following our social distancing measures.

Offsite

We bring a little part of Bletchley Park to you as part of our Outreach program. Students will have the opportunity to take part in interactive workshops, many of which include a demonstration of a real, working Enigma machine.

Online

Students can now access our learning offer through a Virtual Learning Session streamed directly to their classroom or personal device. Your new online learning experience includes a digital tour of the Park, an Enigma demonstration and an interactive workshop session.

Schools Arts Menu

Schools Art Menu provides arts and contemporary craft workshops for all Key Stages led by our Artist Associates, with each workshop held within our specialist resource areas including art studio, ceramic studio, woodshop and silversmith. The Schools Art Menu offers both half and full day workshops for up to 30 students per session led by artists and makers in Ceramics and Pottery, Designing and Making, Exploring geographic & cultural differences in city and landscapes.

The Arts Menu offers students and schools:

- A dedicated learning & participation team, who will work with schools in tailoring an offer best suited to your needs, including working on an offer suited for children with special educational needs.
- Opportunities to work with local, national and international artists in developing projects which make a positive contribution to your community.
- Possibility to connect the children's learning process with an accredited qualification from arts award discover, explore, bronze and silver.

All set within the historic grounds of Great Linford Manor Park, providing green spaces for children to spend their lunch-times and breaks, as well as the opportunity to visit a year-round programme of exhibitions and events, meet on site artists and realise new possibilities of working with materials in a comfortable and welcoming environment.

Work Experience

Long term placements of 3-6 months are encouraged to undertake a Silver Arts Award.

Shorter term placements of 1-2 weeks are encouraged to undertake a Bronze Arts Award.

Online creative resources

Over the course of lockdown Milton Keynes Arts Centre has commissioned 21 artists from all over the UK and beyond to create a series of free online workshops, tutorials, techniques and demonstrations across multiple disciplines for you to follow along at home.

MKAC and Covid-19 guidelines

Milton Keynes Arts Centre is committed to working with schools in continuing to offer young people the opportunity to engage in creativity whilst ensuring the safety of all concerned. The Arts Centre has been open since July 2020 to staff, tutors, students and authorised visitors only. On site, class sizes have been reduced to a maximum of 6 students.

HEADSTART

Arts on Prescription (referral) programme for young people

Using the Arts to improve the health and wellbeing of young people who experience stress, anxiety or depression.

Arts for Health is a local charity that improves health and wellbeing through using the Arts to enhance health care environments and through providing art activities in the community.

HEADSTART is an Arts on Prescription programme that offers young people (aged 6-17) access to high quality arts activities in a low stress, supportive environment. Through focused hands-on activities we provide relaxation and distraction, giving participants personal space away from day to day life.

The Arts we cover currently are visual arts. creative music, and combined arts which add spoke and written word and theatre skills. Art groups are for 13-17yrs; creative music for 6-13yrs and 13-17yrs; combined arts 6-13yrs.

SCHOOLS / Health Centres can request a bespoke series of workshops which will be costed on a case by case basis,

How can HEADSTART help?

- increased confidence
- learning new skills
- distraction from pain and problems
- spending time doing something enjoyable
- making friends

What happens?

When we receive your referral we will write to you and invite you to attend a HEADSTART programme.

Each programme provides up to 12 weekly 2 hour art workshops.

Workshops are small groups of between 8 and 10 young people and led by professional artists. Workshops are currently FREE and all materials are provided.

How can I take part?

HEADSTART is available on a referral basis for young people who experience depression, stress and anxiety.

You can ask your GP, a community support worker or health care provider or teacher if they think it would benefit you. They will need to complete the attached referral form with you.



large Mosaic Murals. I feel a creative approach within education is fundamental for the majority of children. Children love Art and the opportunity to be creative and I believe children thrive when working collaboratively.

Collaborative work is my preferred approach to
working in a school setting when creating a
Mosaic Mural. Children get the opportunity to
feel inclusive and equal, I like to allow for group
participation, as the students love to contribute
ideas as the project progresses. My projects have included
children as young as four, if I am working with the whole
school (which I have done on a couple of occasions) then the
complexity of the work is arranged per age group.

I am also happy to offer Mosaic kits to Schools where children can create their own Mosaic to keep. The cost of a Mosaic project is mainly dependent on the size of the Mosaic and the amount of children

Loughton School

I was in invited to work with Loughton School to created this Mosaic for the Library with the year 4 students. The project was inbuilt into their curriculum whilst they were learning about the Romans.

Wootton Primary School

I worked with 420 children aged 4-11 creating this very large Mosaic across 6 weeks. This Mosaic was placed at the front of the school on one of the exterior walls.

Portfields Primary School

Working as Artist in Residence at the School, I created this large Mosaic Mural with the 720 children aged 4-11 over two months. Every child had the opportunity to lay some tiles. This Mosaic was displayed on the outer public pathway creating a colourful form of school signage.

- Story Telling through dance
- Exploring Indian festivals through dance
- Dance in Health
- Dance and Inclusion
- Contributing to community cohesion and inclusion Agendas

Jane Charles – Creative textile workshops in a school setting

I have over 10 years' experience working in schools on a variety of textile projects. These can range from a 'whole school' textile project resulting in a large quilt or textile installation, over 400 children took part in one of the biggest school quilt projects. I have also worked with single year groups to create individual pieces of batik art and also one large creative printing rainbow of pattern and colour.

Communication is vital with the school to decide what they would like from the finished piece of work, how long we have to make it, how big it can be or where it might hang.

Techniques that have been delivered in Primary age group:

Faux batik (year 2's and in a whole school); Printing with found things; mono printing on fabric for an MK Parks Trust project in Great Linford; Collage and embroidery; Simple weaving; polystyrene block printing;

I generally work with the children in small groups of 6-10 children depending on the technique.

There have also been a number of projects that Jane has delivered in the community, but would work equally well in a Secondary School Setting:

MK50 Roundabout quilt for Adult Learning in 2017 working with adult learners and clients from the Macintyre charity – including print, batik and collage with stitch.

Lino printing; batik; free motion embroidery; indigo dyeing; eco printing and eco dyeing; **Slated Row/Future Wolverton project** – 2018 designing and printing the soft furnishings for an enterprising project next to the school – an Air BnB. The pupils then had the opportunity to help run the BnB and the café next door.

MK Parks trust – with Great Linford Parkland 2019 (ongoing) – a textile project for the whole community: printing; indigo dyeing; mono printing; eco printing and embroidery. Sewn together 2020 – a community quilt where over 100 people took part (ages 7-86) to create a 14' quilt over lockdown. This would work really well as a department quilt using different textile techniques or a whole school quilt.
