Three Priority Project Examples

1. MK'S 60th Birthday, 2027

(MK50 was a fantastic opportunity to support people, wonderful spirit of celebration. We'd like to build on that.)

- Longer term aspiration for City of Culture
- Apprenticeships thrilled to fund it, after the pilot, evaluate and look to secure another round
- Youth led programming
- Tech/ Innovation

2. New City Archive 2- 3yr activity on Design Heritage: USP

Archives Project

Up to £400 000 investment dependent on National Lottery Heritage Fund bid. 4 major Archives at Bucks Archives, MKCDC, Living Archive and MK Museum Wolverton Works Archive

Add in other important archives e.g. OU, MK Heritage Association Members, other archives within community.

New City Archive to be fully representative of the communities who make up MK. E.g. Funded projects 2023/24:

- 1.Roda and African Diaspora Foundation work
- 2. Anouar's work (MKIAC) with Young People and Refugee stories
- 3. Nana's work around Black History Month

PARTNERS to bring together collections and programme in one physical place.

New City Archive Activity Programme has 3 Parts:

- 1. CDC working with the OU on Planning and Design Identity
- 2. Living Archive lead on resident and community estates
- 3. Bucks Archives lead contemporary collections strand

Vic Gibb's work with Offset projects and Young People, reinventing what is meant by archives.

Project will use the New Town Heritage Toolkit created in a previous project so communities can articulate the heritage value of their spaces. See New Town Heritage Explorers | Milton Keynes City Council (milton-keynes.gov.uk)

Activity Project informs capital project and £500,000 Tariff ring fenced for the archives facility, but more capital funds needed.

3. CMK Design Heritage Trail Pilot

Partnership project across Central Milton Keynes (CMK)

Recommendations Report concluded that separate heritage, public art and green trails were one design heritage trail and to test this with audiences.

Heritage Area - Design heritage trail, 6 week project using signs with QR codes to link to web content at www.lookagainmk.city Targeted at specific audiences to 'Look Again'.

MK Forum running a set of tours. SD welcomes feedback on this and the website has a survey on 'Feedback' button.

Late 2024-5 MAIN PROJECT

Evidence from a successful Pilot will unlock further investment into a Main Project.

Understanding what young people want from our city. Young People actively adding content.
